



## Your Commute Options in Downtown Sacramento

### *Commuter Spending Account*

The Commuter Spending Account through WageWorks is a pre-tax benefit account used to pay for public transit, train, bus, eligible vanpool and qualified parking as part of your daily commute to work. For 2017, the contribution maximum is \$255 per month for transit; eligible vanpool expenses; or qualified parking expenses.

### *Emergency Ride Home Program*

All Kaiser Permanente employees working in the Downtown Sacramento area are eligible to register with the Sacramento Regional Commuter Club, regardless of commute method. This program guarantees a ride home up to six times each year.



### *Bike to Work Reimbursement Program*

Kaiser Permanente will reimburse up to \$20/month (\$240 a year) for your bicycle expenses through the WageWorks Bike to Work Reimbursement Program.

## Park and Shuttle



A dedicated surface parking lot just for KP employees will be available at 2300 Front Street. A shuttle service will operate from the lot to all our downtown medical offices.

At only \$40 per month, parking at the KP lot will be significantly less than the average cost of parking in the immediate downtown area. In addition, your monthly pass gives you unlimited parking at the lot- including weekends and nights when you want to go downtown for something other than work.

Those who carpool will pay \$20 per space; vanpool parking will be free; and both will have designated parking spaces.

### Employee Lot features:

- 300 spaces
- Shuttle shelter
- On-site security
- Key card access
- ADA compliant
- Bike and pedestrian friendly lanes and paths serve entire trip between KP and lot

### Shuttle features:

- Shuttles to operate 6:30 a.m. to 7 p.m.
- Shuttle to run every 7-15 minutes
- 7-minute shuttle ride to Downtown Commons Medical Offices
- ADA compliant

## Carpool and Vanpool

You can cut your commute costs by more than half by sharing the ride with someone who makes the same commute to work daily. By carpooling or vanpooling, you can park at a reduced rate in the dedicated Employee Parking lot and have access to the HOV (High Occupancy Vehicle) lanes on the freeway or highway.

### Carpool

- A carpool is two or more employees who commute to work together at least three days a week. Those participating in the carpool program will get 50% off the cost of parking in the Employee Parking Lot and have access to designated carpool spaces. The reduced rate can be shared among those carpooling.
- Each member of the carpool group will need to register for the commuter program as a carpool user.

### Vanpool

- A vanpool is a group of seven to 15 people who commute together in a van on a regular basis. The coordinator usually drives and maintains the vehicle while the riders pay a monthly fare.
- Vanpool groups receive a \$50 monthly vanpool subsidy and free designated parking at the Employee Parking lot.

### Transit

Through the Commuter Spending Account, you have two options: Use the money you have elected to deduct from your paychecks to purchase transit passes directly; or choose the WageWorks Commuter Card to pay for any transit costs.
